Welcome and Introductions - Grand Boudrault, Kawartha Lakes area DSC-PIC Chair


TLDSB Update - Larry Hope, Director of Education

- o Labour update escalating action by teacher unions in the province at this point in time
- Relationship between TLDSB and local union leadership is very good, we continue to work very closely with local leadership. We are doing everything we can possibly can and keep this dispute between the provincial government and the provincial leadership of the unions.
- We are doing everything we can to keep students in school and keep students safe.
 While there are concerns about report cards and extra curriculars, it is safety that is the priority
- Next Tuesday, all schools will be closed to students because elementary and secondary students will be on strike for one day.
- There will likely be an escalation in elementary teacher job action activity. Secondary teachers are about 3 weeks ahead of ETFO
- Daycares will remain open at schools during the one day strike
- There will be some things that will start to be cancelled. We are recommending that any programs that involve the collection of money are to stop. Our principals cannot manage this on our own as support staff will not do the work that other bargaining units normally do; there will be a cessation of extra curricular activities away from schools sports, winter electives, etc.;
- Secondary students will have a bare bones report card for semester 1 just marks without comments; we are in the process of making a final determination about elementary report cards and it is a possibility that we might not be able to process report cards.
- SEcondary school teachers will not do the work of other teachers who are absent and we do not have a quantity of secondary supply staff. This means that if a teacher is

- absent and is responsible for an extracurricular activity during the day, the practice or event will be cancelled.
- We appreciate the ongoing support from families as we work our way through this challenging time


Experiential Learning and Skilled Trades - Katherine MacIver, Superintendent of Learning

- What is experiential learning it is hands-on, real world learning that may include career fairs, classroom visits/career talks from skilled tradespeople, cooperative education, job shadowing, one-on-one career mentorship
- Project-based learning, workplace tours.
- Leaders of experiential learning work closely with industry partners and the community to create experiential learning opportunities



- Skills Ontario competitions with students from grade 4 to college take place each year
 and can range from a 4-person build to a graphic design, fashion design, welding, and
 more the Ontario competition this year is on May 6th. Local competitions are held in
 TLDSB called "Best in TLDSB" to determine who will compete at the provincial
 competition
- In high schools there is a half credit course called Career Studies that all grade 10 students must take there is a strong financial literacy program in the course
- Cooperative education is available to all students in all different pathways where they
 can work in placements for credits towards their diploma.

- Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) programs are clusters and bundles of credits that
 give students a specialization while they are in high school. Students take specific credits
 as well as specific certifications. Cooperative education is a part of every SHSM program.
- Dual Credits are available for grade 11 and 12 students where a high school credit and a college credit can be earned at the same time. TLDSB partners with Georgian College, Durham College, and Fleming College to offer courses at the college or with a college instructor at a secondary school.
- Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) offers a program where students who
 are going into a skilled trade can start building their apprenticeship hours while they are
 in high school.

- Huntsville Public School Council Chair Stasi OHare provided an summary overview of the Paul Davis Social Networking Safety presentation that took place in Huntsville on December 5th
- Almost 200 Huntsville area parents attended the presentation and a follow up survey indicated that the information received was excellent and timely

- Funding Updates
 - Parent Engagement Funding for Schools (\$500 grant) information about the additional funding from Board Parent Engagement a survey has been sent to school council chairs providing an opportunity for a top up of up to \$200 for parent engagement initiatives. The survey link will be sent out one more time. DSC-PIC regional chairs will review the list and allocate the funds to schools based on requests.
 - Parents Reaching Out (PRO) Grant Funding being allocated to the Paul Davis Social Networking Safety. It was felt that since the reporting and evaluation required for the use of the PRO grant funding, that allocating this money to the safety networking presentations would be best.
- School Council communication There is now a Google Shared Drive for school council chairs. School council chairs were asked to create a Gmail address for their school council using the three letters of the school plus the words "school council". They are then to send the login and password to Catherine Shedden, and to use catherine.shedden@tldsb.on.ca as the default email. This way there will be information archived of school council emails to send to new chairs as they occur at schools.
